ONSITE PRESENTATIONS

Thank you for volunteering to judge presentations at the University Undergraduate Research and Arts Forum (UURAF) happening on April 14th at the Breslin Center. Proceed to the location of your assigned presentations to begin judging. All judging must be complete by 5:00 PM Eastern on April 14th.

Judge presentations according to the following criteria:

- DELIVERY: The presentation was organized and delivered in a clear, engaging, and professional manner.
- COMPREHENSIBILITY: The presentation could be understood by an educated but non-expert audience.
- SIGNIFICANCE: The presenter explained the significance of the work, and how it contributes to broader research on the subject area.
- ELEMENTS: The presenter adequately addressed the project's essential elements: *Introduction, literature review, conceptual framework, methods, & analysis*
- CURRENT STATUS: The presenter effectively illustrated the current status of the project (e.g., results, discussion of findings)
- VISUAL AIDS: The visual aids were appropriate, effectively used, and appealing.

SCORING: A five-point scale is used to score each criterion. Points are added up to determine a total score. Maximum total score is 30 points. **IMPORTANT: THERE CAN ONLY BE ONE FIRST-PLACE WINNER IN YOUR CATEGORY.**

After reviewing each presentation, select the one that should win first place by using the spreadsheet shared with you at check-in. Once you have selected the first-place winner, return this form to the judging table as soon as possible.
