



# UURAF | JUDGING DIRECTIONS

## ONLINE PRESENTATIONS

Thank you for volunteering to judge presentations at the University Undergraduate Research and Arts Forum (UURAF) virtually at <https://symposium.foragerone.com/uuraf2023>. Judging can be completed at any point from April 12-14<sup>th</sup>. To easily access the presentations assigned to you, log into your Symposium account. Select the "Judging" tab at the top of the page. **All judging must be complete by 5:00 PM Eastern on April 14<sup>th</sup>.**

Judge presentations according to the following criteria:

- DELIVERY: The presentation was organized and delivered in a clear, engaging, and professional manner.
- COMPREHENSIBILITY: The presentation could be understood by an educated but non-expert audience.
- SIGNIFICANCE: The presenter explained the significance of the work, and how it contributes to broader research on the subject area.
- ELEMENTS: The presenter adequately addressed the project's essential elements: *Introduction, literature review, conceptual framework, methods, & analysis*
- CURRENT STATUS: The presenter effectively illustrated the current status of the project (e.g., results, discussion of findings)
- VISUAL AIDS: The visual aids were appropriate, effectively used, and appealing.

SCORING: A five-point scale is used to score each criterion. Points are added up to determine a total score. Maximum total score is 30 points. **IMPORTANT: THERE CAN ONLY BE ONE FIRST-PLACE WINNER IN YOUR CATEGORY.**

After reviewing each presentation, select the one that should win first place by using the online spreadsheet shared with you earlier by Undergraduate Research staff.
