

- Preliminary

- Work conducted during any semester (fall, spring, summer) or over multiple semesters
- · Work conducted during high school
- Presented at other venues (college/department forums, off-campus conferences, etc.)
- Any stage of the research process (literature review, method development, etc.)
- Other types that we missed on this list!

All presenters must complete Level 1 Responsible Conduct of Research (RCR) training to be eligible for awards. Level 1 RCR training includes the following modules: Introduction, Authorship, Research Misconduct, and Plagiarism.
