





Purpose and Responsibilities

EVALUATION CRITERIA:

Evaluate the poster and oral presentations using the criteria below.

Statement of research problem/rationale

- Clearly states the hypothesis or question(s) addressed.
- Effectively explains the justification/significance of the project.

Literature Review

- Adequately cites existing research or scholarship regarding the topic.
- Explains why this study is needed (e.g., to fill gaps or add to existing knowledge).

Methods/Theoretical Framework:

- Clearly describes the methods used and/or theoretical approaches.

Analysis/Results:

- Clearly and accurately presents findings or arguments.

Discussion/Conclusion:

- Explains the importance of the findings.



Purpose and Responsibilities, continued

To provide constructive feedback to student presenters based on the following rubric:

- **Delivery:** The presentation was organized and delivered in a clear, engaging, and professional manner.
- **Comprehensibility:** The presentation could be understood by an educated but non-expert audience.
- **Significance:** The presenter explained the significance of the work, and how the work contributes to broader research on the subject area.
- **Elements:** The presenter adequately addressed the project's essential elements (e.g., introduction, literature review, conceptual framework, methods, and analysis).
- **Current status:** The presenter effectively illustrated the current status of the project (e.g., results obtained, discussion of findings).
- **Visual aids:** The visual aids were appropriate, effectively used, and appealing.



Evaluation Form

- **Online format**
 - Qualtrics link will be provided at check in

 - Will be provided on a needed basis
 - You will need to input information at UURAF
 - Computers onsite for you to input evaluations into system
 - Students will get feedback with in 4 hours



Tips and Considerations

- An opportunity to practice **teaching** and **mentoring**
- Practice providing **feedback**
- For many presenters, it is their **first time** giving a presentation
- Be **thoughtful** and **supportive** in your feedback
- Feel free to **ask** questions and **engage** with presenters
 - Some may use this as practice for national conferences
 - Some may use this for graduate school
- Help them share their **research story!**




What to Expect
